



Frequently Asked Questions on - Regulation Education Module (REM)

What is the REM?

REM is an online tool designed to provide MRT and ENP professionals the information they need to know and understand practice standards in Alberta. There are five chapters in this REM with a total of 28 multiple choice questions on the following topics:

- the *Health Professions Act* and other statutes of legislation
- Module 2:** [Public Accountability](#)
- the complaints process and other ways in which the College is accountable to Albertans
- Module 3:** [Professional practice](#)
- the restricted activities members are authorized to perform

- the Standards of Practice and Code of Ethics
- Module 5:** [Continuing Competence Program](#)
- the Continuing Competence Program

A 100% score is required in each of the five modules to complete REM. The College is offering REM as a learning tool to students, it does not require students to complete REM.

How do I benefit from REM?

REM will help you prepare for your future professional practice by enabling:

- Understanding of self-regulation
- The responsibilities of being a regulated health professional
- Understanding of the College's regulatory pillars

How can I access REM?

Do I have to do REM?

Your education program may require you to complete REM. From the College's perspective, REM is optional, however we highly recommend it.

Upon completion of your education to practice your specialty and when you apply to be a regulated member of the ACMDTT, you will be required to complete REM again, as information in the REM may have changed.

You have free access to REM until you complete your education program.
